

Regular Minutes of the City Council

CALL TO ORDER THE PRE-COUNCIL MEETING: Council President Colvin called the Pre-Council Meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. on Monday, June 20, 2022, in the Council Chambers in the Municipal Complex. Councilman Tapley, Councilman Eric Brown, Councilman Chris Brown, and Councilman Keel were present.

Ordinance 2022-22: Al Jones informed the Council that this ordinance will approve the sale of the last of the former Russell properties that the City owns except the buildings that the City actually uses and the "ash pit".

Resolution 22-72: Miles Hamlet informed the Council that the City received no bids for Bid 22-11 and that passing this resolution will allow him to find the best prices for aggregate for the Sewer Department.

Event Request: Stacey Jeffcoat from Main Street Alexander City informed the Council that people come from all over the United States to participate in the Song Writers' Festival, and there will be a concert on Saturday night. Stacey also said the event will be a boost for local restaurants and hotels.

REPORT FROM STANDING COMMITTEES:

Finance: The Clerk's office has reviewed the applications for the Revenue Clerk position and interviews are in progress.

Public Safety Committee: The Fire Department assisted with Camp Conquest's Burn Camp last week at Children's Harbor. This camp is put on by the Pediatric Burn Foundation of Alabama. The blue 911 address signs are available again. If you would like to have one for your residence, please call the Fire Department. The Fire Department is continuing to flush hydrants around the City. The Police Department is currently taking applications for patrol officers.

Utilities Committee: The Gas Department met with Sheppard Services to schedule SCADA installation. They also ran a new main to the Lee St. Development. The annual gas system survey should be completed in July. The Gas, Light, and Water departments have been working to provide utilities to the Wharf Development and future development behind it. The Light Department has been trimming around the power lines and rights-of-way. Over the past couple of weeks, the Water Department has set up 12 new services and repaired 12 water leaks; several new services are in the process of being installed. Contractors are working on the sewer project along HWY 280 to the Lake Martin Regional Industrial Park in Kellyton for the Alabama Graphite Development. Approximately 1200 ft of 10" sewer gravity line has been replaced at the Byers Field Easement.

Parks and Recreation Committee: Just about all of the youth softball teams have made it to the State Championships. Eight youth baseball teams are representing Alexander City at State Championships. Sonny is teaching a class every Friday for ages 10 and up on life skills such as changing tires, oil, etc. Both pools are up and running. Thirty teams participated in a golf tournament at Lakewinds Golf Course this past weekend.

Public Works Committee: Council President Colvin reported for Councilman Hardy. Heavy construction is ongoing at The Heritage development at Wicker Point. Streets, water lines, pump stations, etc., are being constructed, and the project appears to be on schedule. Russell Medical is hauling about 75 loads of soil from our landfill per day for the Legacy Development. Several employees are still out with COVID; please be patient with us.

Buildings and Properties Committee: Over 200 books have been donated to the library in the last two weeks. These gifts are tax-deductible and placed in the book sale room. Mamie's Place Children's Library has experienced outstanding attendance for its summer reading programs so far. On June 21st, Ventriloquist Gene Cordova will be there at 10 AM. On June 22nd, they will have games and puzzles at 10 AM. On June 23rd, Starshine Faces will be there at 10 AM. They will have several free educational programs for kids. Applications for a vacant library board seat will remain open until the end of June. Applications are available at the main desk of the library and through the City's website.

Romy stated that there was a substantial difference from this this time last year, \$700,000 less than last month. The accounts hold a little over one million dollars than this time last year.
