ORDINANCE NO. <u>2022-25</u>

An Ordinance to Amend the Alexander City Codes Relating to Water Tap Fees and Improvement Fee and other Water Operations

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Alexander City, Alabama, as follows:

SECTION 1. Amend Section 90-53 – Water Capital Improvement Fees be amended as follows:

(d) Fee determination.

(1) Schedule of fees: The Superintendent of Utilities shall determine the amount of the water capital improvement fees for residential and nonresidential uses based on the type and size of the water meter using the following schedule:

SECTION 2. Section 90-53 – Water Capital Improvement Fee as follows:

Remove the 3/4" water meter.

Water Capital Improvement Fee Schedule		
Water Meter Size	EDUs per Meter	Water Capital Improvement Fee
3/4"	0.6	\$566

SECTION 3. Section 90 – 53 - Water Capital Improvement Fees, Subsection D Fee Determination, Paragraph 4 Irrigation, be amended as follows:

4. Irrigation: Any separate water meter installed for irrigation / recreational purposes shall be subject to the assessment of a water capital improvements fee at the rates shown in the above schedule. This section does not apply to parcels with existing water services.

SECTION 4. Rescind Section 90-53 – Water Capital Improvement Fee, (7) Refunds, and (8) Miscellaneous Provisions.

SECTION 5. That Sections 90-147 – Availability of water outside city and Section 90-148 - Minimum water connection charges inside the city be combined to state the following:

Section 90-147 - Availability of Water connection inside and outside the city.

(a) Water service shall be made available to residents inside and outside the corporate limits of the city on existing water lines for the connection fee as follows:

1 inch... \$1,652.00 and capital improvement fee, if applicable

2-inch service and above... Cost Plus and capital improvement fee, if applicable

- (b) Prior to making any additions (water main, multiple connections, etc.) to the system, the water system department head shall be responsible for determining the proper size pipe considering the necessity for future expansion, but in no case shall any pipe be installed smaller than six inches outside diameter.
- (c) In addition, line extensions will not be made unless an adequate number of customers will be added to the system.

SECTION 6. Rescind Section 90-149 – Water Connection Charges Outside City

SECTION 7. If any paragraph, section, subsection, or provision of this ordinance be declared invalid in a court of competent jurisdiction for any reason, it shall not affect the remainder of the ordinance as pertains to its validity or to other applications.

SECTION 8. Any ordinance or provisions of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed and rescinded insofar as they conflict with the provisions of this ordinance.

This ordinance will be published in compliance with Section 11-45-3, Code of Alabama 1975.

This ordinance shall become effective October 1, 2022.

WHEREAS, Act 2019-2, Rebuild Alabama, was approved on March 6, 2019, by the Alabama Legislature; and

WHEREAS, said act, provides for the collection of an additional excise tax on gasoline and diesel fuel and distributes proceeds to the state, counties, and municipalities for maintenance, improvement, replacement, and construction of roads and bridges; and

WHEREAS, with the additional funding the governing body is required to adopt an Annual Transportation Plan no later than August 31st each year for the following fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the City of Alexander City, City Council approved the FY22 Transportation Plan as Resolution 21-113 on August 16, 2021, to continue to work on the FY21 Transportation plan; and

WHEREAS, Gerard Brewer, City Engineer, updated the Council in December 2021 of the need to use funds from Rebuild Alabama for required maintenance needed for Coven Abbett Bridge at an estimated cost of \$396,840.00; and

WHEREAS, as of July 7, 2022, the City has a balance of \$242,244.88 for Rebuild Alabama, Act 2019-2; and

WHEREAS, the Engineering department plans on applying for a Rebuild Alabama Act Grant in October 2022 to assist with the funding needed for this required maintenance; and

WHEREAS, the Council will be updated in January 2023 on the status of the grant decision and the Council can then decide how to proceed; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Alexander City, Alabama, hereby adopts said transportation plan for FY23, per the requirement of Act 2019-2, Rebuild Alabama.

"Game Room" space located in the Cooper Community Center, Alexander City, AL including use of gym when not scheduled for other purposes and use of restroom facilities.

"Game Room" shall be used for the purpose of a Summer Day Camp with arts and crafts, and games for children age 8-12 during Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m.

2. The terms of this lease shall be for a period from July 1, 2022 to July 31, 2022. The

Lessee agrees to pay the Lessor the sum of **One Hundred & 00/100 Dollars (\$100.00)** per week.

3. Lessee shall be responsible for normal maintenance (not associated with structural defects) and to keep the premises clean and sanitary.

4. Lessee agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the Lessor from any and all suits, Court costs, attorney's fees or judgments as the result of any personal injury claim or suit arising from Lessee's use of the premises during the term of this Lease.

5. Lessee during the term hereof, at its own sole cost and expense, shall keep all furniture, fixtures, equipment and inventory that it supplies, insured to the extent of its full insurable value for loss or damage of any casualty including fire, storm, or flood. Lessor shall have no responsibility for payment of insurance for said purpose or reimbursing Lessee for any loss. Lessor shall maintain casualty insurance on the building and Lessee shall have no obligation

to provide casualty insurance on the building in which the Lessee operates its business.

6. Lessee shall not sublet nor assign this lease nor the premises or any part thereof without prior express written consent of Lessor.

7. Lessee shall not alter, change, enlarge, or in any way substantially change the premises without the prior express written consent of Lessor.

8. Lessor retains the right to terminate this Lease upon the breach of any covenant or agreement contained herein.

9. Lessor grants to Lessee the right to renew this lease at its termination at a term and rent to be agreed upon between the parties.
