



Regular Minutes of the City Council

Monday, March 19, 2018 --- Meeting at 5:30 p.m.

CALL TO ORDER THE PRE-COUNCIL MEETING: Council President Spraggins called the Pre-Council Meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. on Monday, March 19, 2018, in the Council Chambers of the Criminal Justice Building. Councilman Tapley, Councilwoman Colvin, Councilman Hardy, Councilman Brown, Council President Tommy Spraggins, and Councilman Funderburk were present.

During the Pre-Council Meeting Council President Spraggins asked the following persons to inform the Council of the following items:

Chief Turner spoke to the Council concerning the proposed resolution to reclassify four (4) current jailer positions to one (1) administrative assistant, one (1) evidence clerk, and two (2) animal control positions. Chief explained that by reclassifying the four positions the city would have 24-hour service for the animal control division and decrease the amount of time the department houses evidence.

Al Jones spoke to the Council concerning the proposed resolution to complete Phase Two of the Central Blvd. and to amend the current capital budget by \$100,000. The lowest and only bid received to complete phase two was for approximately \$597,000, which is approximately \$106,000 short. \$75,000 was set-aside in the 17/18 Capital Budget. Phase one cost significantly more than the second phase. There will be one more phase to complete after the completion of phase two.

Gerard Brewer informed the Council that Ingram Grading and Paving submitted the only bid for ACRIP. The bid amount was \$1,136,904.91. The ACRIP project should be complete in 6 weeks. The cost difference between the ACRIP project and Phase Two of Central Blvd is the demolition and reconstruction for ACRIP versus curb and gutter for Central Blvd.

Chief Turner informed the Council that both requested events have been approved by him and they are annual events.

Hearing no further discussion or questions, Council President Spraggins ended the Pre-Council Meeting.
