ORDINANCE NO. 2022-06

An Ordinance to Authorize an "Amnesty Week" to Obtain Past Due Fines/Monies Owed to the Alexander City Municipal Court

WHEREAS, an "Amnesty Week" is a designated period of time during which a defendant may voluntarily appear before the Alexander City Court Magistrate and satisfy any past fines/monies owed by the defendant to the court.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Alexander City, Alabama, while in a regular session on January 24, 2022, at 5:30 p.m. as follows:

SECTION 1. An "Amnesty Week" be and is hereby authorized beginning Monday, March 14, 2022, and ending on Friday, March 18, 2022, 8:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. each day.

SECTION 2. Defendants may appear before the Alexander City Municipal Court office personnel to pay for outstanding fines/monies for misdemeanors charges, which were adjudicated and fines assessed prior to January 2020.

SECTION 3. Defendants may receive a 20% discount on outstanding fines/monies only during said "Amnesty Week".

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its adoption and publication or by it otherwise becoming law.

RESOLUTION NO. 22-31

A Resolution Consenting to the Settlement of Litigation styled City of Alexander City, Alabama v. Endo U.S. District Court, Middle District of Alabama, Eastern Division

WHEREAS, the City of Alexander City ("City") by Resolution 2018-46 dated February 19, 2018, did join all litigation involving the "OPIOD" national litigation and employed the Beasley Allen law firm to represent the City; and

WHEREAS, the State of Alabama did settle all claims against two of the many defendants, ENDO Health Solutions, Inc. and Endo Pharmaceuticals, Inc. (collectively "Endo") for the amount of Ten Million & 00/100 Dollars (\$10,000.00); and

WHEREAS, the settlement involves the State as well as all political subdivisions of the State, which includes the City; and

WHEREAS, the settlement is based on dividing the proceeds 40% to the political subdivisions and 60% to the State, less attorney fees and costs of litigation; and

WHEREAS, the political subdivisions' shares were determined by a Special Master based on an allocation model determined by the population as per the 2012 Census date; and

WHEREAS, based on said data and model, the City is to receive the sum of Forty-One Thousand, One Hundred Forty-Six & 00/100 Dollars (\$41,146.00) less 1/3 attorney fees and approximately One Thousand Three Hundred Eighty-Four & 00/Dollars (\$1,384.00) in litigation costs; and

WHEREAS, in order to receive the City's share of the funds, the City must sign a document entitled ENDO Settlement Sign-On. If the City fails to sign such documents the City will not share in the settlement funds and will have no other recourse against ENDO.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Alexander City, Alabama, does hereby agree to the settlement and authorizes the Mayor to execute the ENDO Settlement Sign-On document and any other documents necessary to receive the settlement funds due to the City. (See attached document - ENDO Settlement Sign-On).


